- The cancellation of bus routes, often dependant on bus drivers being away, they require special training - Angus - scheduling does account for need in specific areas, time off requests could be denied if service will suffer, all hands on deck when necessary (ie: district mechanic filling in)

Wall of Wonder - Inclusion Board

- A great way to educate on topics that may not be well known (ie: SOGI, anxiety) speak
 to principals to ensure topics are relevant, avoid tokening messaging should come from
 their own voices
- Jacquelyn will post on DPAC website as linked resources, a calendar that highlights specific awareness topics in relation to inclusion, as they are recognized throughout the year, would be helpful to create a schedule of sorts. Ideally these resources will assist PACs to start and/ or continue with this initiative - ACTION ITEM: Ashley to share Albert McMahon's existing boards with Jacquelyn

Eric Scott - Creating Consent Culture - 20 minute presentation - how to help parents teach consent with their children (parameters on teaching consent) - has presented to other school districts as well - could be considered a Parent Education piece

Chair Carter - PAC purchases / items donated to PAC as a way to raise money to enhance student learning experience

- Big or small ticket items (ie: bbq, tickets) do these items belong to the school district? Should not be allowed to be resold for profit. If items 'belong' to the district how are they tracking? Upkeep? Who is replacing it if it goes missing?
- No policy noted that outlines parameters / expectation
- Charitable / corporate donations taxable benefits vs non (better that items are donated to an entity (PAC) vs. person specific, typically items should not be passed along to another school (unless maybe a school closure)
 - There should be more accountability from the district too

- Working to address safety with respect to gangs, vaping, etc.
- Working on Indigenous grad requirements
- Board has met with the city/MLA's, continuing to advocate for more buildings in the school district
